## **Judson Baptist Retreat Center**INFORMATION TO CAMPERS

- We have included the cost of concessions in basic fee. Each camper will be allowed one (6 oz) coke and one candy bar or peanut butter crackers in the afternoon and in the evening. We will serve tea or Koolaide at meals. PLEASE DO NOT ALLOW THE CAMPERS TO BRING CANDY, FOOD OR GUM FROM HOME. We promise that they will not go hungry!!!!!
- 2) Each camper has the opportunity to bring a missions offering with him/her to camp. How much he/she brings and if he/she brings will be up to each parent. Please place this offering in a sealed envelope marked missions offering and turn it in to your camper's staffer upon arrival at camp.
- Any camper on medication that must be given at camp needs to bring that medication in one (1) large ziplock bag with each prescription medication in original prescription bottle. Please give this bag to person responsible for checking in campers. Do not pack in suitcases. If this is prepared in advance, it helps tremendously at check-in time! We will have one adult who will be responsible for giving out medication. A card will be sent home at the end of camp telling you each time the medication was given and if it was skipped, the reason. No camper will be allowed to stay at camp on Monday with lice or lice nit infestation. Please check for this problem prior to camp and take actions prescribed for treatment. Camper must be nit-free.
- 4) Campers are not allowed to call home. Parents may call and check on campers if they feel it is necessary during regular office hours. (8:30 am to 4:30 pm) There are only two phone lines and they are for business use only. If a camper becomes ill, is injured, or is intensely homesick, parents will be notified promptly.
- Judson Baptist Retreat Center has a dress code, which we believe is consistent with what the Bible teaches about our actions as Christians. One of the items that have been a problem in the past is the swimsuit. We ask that any girl bringing a two-piece swimsuit or even one that exposes the middrif in any fashion, please bring a dark T-shirt to wear over it even while swimming. We do not want you to have to purchase a swimsuit just for camp and this alleviates that necessity.
